



The Women in your Life

Women are so different than men. That seems to state the obvious, but it's so often overlooked.

Today, I want to suggest something simple and yet so powerful. You will be amazed if you go after the following. If you are married consider these 3 things:

1. List out the things you love, appreciate and are so thankful for about your wife if you are married. If you are single do so with your mother, or sister or a close female friend. *(Be very specific and keep this list between you and Jesus)*
2. Do that list in this way: Pray this prayer: *"Jesus show me the glory and the beauty of my wife's life. (or mother's or sister's life) Give me eyes to see her the way You do."*
3. Then write down what Jesus shows you and what you see and continue to add to it every couple of days. I suggest doing this in your iPhone *(in the notes section)* and read over what Jesus brings to light and add to it each time you read it over.

I promise **you will be stunned**. We will revisit this next week to show you how to take this into everyday life.

The reality is this: Women, until they have heard from Jesus, don't think they are truly beautiful and are enough. Ultimately, only Jesus can tell a woman who she is and that she is truly beautiful and is more than enough.

But you as a man and her husband (or son or brother) can play such a major role in her life by the way you see her. Yes, it's probably pretty easy to certain things in her that may annoy you, certain things that she does not "understand", and certain things she does not see that seem so obvious to you as a man. She's a woman, she is not supposed to. You don't want her to be a man. But you can inspire a woman to become a better woman by the way you see her and speak to her beauty and her beautiful heart. This is key. It's how you see her—not so much for where she presently is, but for what she could become. This is where faith comes in and hearing from Jesus.

So here is my encouragement. Pray that prayer and write out that list and add to it and next week, I'll suggest a couple of things to move this from theory into reality.
